**ORDER**

The resolution of the Academic Council on the matter of improvement of Internal marks for B.Tech.students under 2000,2004 and 2009 regulations was implemented as per the U.O read as 1st paper above. The decisions are as follows:

1. **B.Tech. students of 2000, 2004 and 2009 regulations who have completed B.Tech. course work will be given chance to improve their internal marks in the failed subjects, in the colleges they studied.**
2. **In case the college or course they studied does not exist now, they can register in a college willing to take up them.**
3. **In all such cases, the maximum internal marks after improvement should be limited to 70% for 2000 and 2004 schemes and 75% for 2009 scheme candidates.**
4. **The candidates who wish so to improve the internal marks will register with the University paying a prescribed registration fee.**
5. **The internal continuous assessment should be done as per the scheme and regulations the student studied earlier.**
6. **Such improvement of internal marks will not be permitted for the student who have passed the B Tech degree.**
7. **The fee for the internal examination will prescribed by the Syndicate.**

As per U O read as (2) above, the resolution of the Syndicate held on 01-06-2016, regarding the fee for the improvement of internal examinations of B.Tech. students under 2000, 2004 and 2009 regulations.

1. **Rs.1000/- per course ( or paper) as examination charges, which is to be collected by the College.**
2. **Rs.500/- per course ( or paper) as registration fee, which is to be paid to the university fund.**

**3. The other conditions will be governed by the U O No. 3238/2016/Admn dated 22-03-2016.**

The B.Tech. Branch ( tabulation branch) needed certain clarifications and the same was forwarded to the Dean, Faculty of Engineering for his remarks. The Dean suggested the following modalities .

**1.The highest marks in the theory exam. scored by the candidate so far in the University examinations may be counted or made applicable.**

**2. The moderation, if applicable, may be that of the theory exam. in which the candidate scored the highest marks so far for that specific subject, as per the norms prevailing then will be applied.**

**3. The eligibility for improvement of internal marks may be given for all courses of all semesters, which the candidate has not passed so far.**

**4. Since this improvement is not coinciding with any other regular course work duration in the college, the improvement may be offered as a one-time programme and can be advertised now for the even semester, once for all.**

**5.The month and year of passing the improvement exam may be considered as the month and year of passing the subject. A minimum of 45 days and a maximum of 90 days can be given for completing the internal assessment process.**

**6. Only one chance can be given for all the remaining failed papers, for improving the internal marks, if necessary. If a paper is already having the necessary internal marks such that the improvement of the internal marks is not going to aid the passing of the paper, the candidate is not eligible to improve such papers.**

**7. If the candidate wishes to improve the internal marks of N subjects, the candidate may be asked to make a fees payment to the University for all these N subjects as a single amount and then the corresponding amount to the college concerned as a single amount. The college should assign a staff member to the candidate concerned as coordinator. The names of these coordinators along with the candidates should be reported to the University, as a list, for all such candidates. The coordinator should arrange to distribute the subjects involved to teachers handling that subject now in the college. Each teacher concerned should conduct necessary assignments, test papers etc. as given in the specific scheme and syllabus of the subject. If marks are earmarked for attendance also, the teacher concerned can assign specific days of works to the candidate and assess the marks for attendance based on this. This needs to be only limited days, since the candidate has already qualified the attendance requirements while doing the regular course earlier. The teacher handling the subject should forward the internal assessment marks within a maximum of 100 days to the University through the coordinating teacher and Principal of the college. The duration of the internal assessment shall be 45 days minimum and 90 days maximum, at the discretion of the teacher concerned.**

Considering the suggestions of the Dean read as (3) above, the Academic council at its meeting held on 13-12-2016 has resolved vide paper read as (4) above, to approve the suggestions of the Dean, Faculty of Engineering to solve the issues related to the implementation of the resolution of the Academic Council read as (1) above, regarding the improvement of Internal examinations of B Tech students under 2000,2004 and 2009 schemes.

The Hon. Vice Chancellor has accorded sanction to implement the resolution of Academic Council read above and the following orders are therefore issued.

**1.The highest marks in the theory exam scored by the candidate so far in the University examinations will be counted or made applicable.**

2. The moderation, if applicable, will be that of the theory exam in which the candidate scored the highest marks so far for that specific subject, as per the norms prevailing then will be applied.
3. The eligibility for improvement of internal marks will be given for all courses of all semesters, which the candidate has not passed so far.
4. Since this improvement is not coinciding with any other regular course work duration in the college, the improvement will be offered as a one-time programme and can be advertised now for the even semester, once for all.
