SYLLABUS

The syllabus for various subjects is clearly classified into different units

Duration of the course

The course shall extend over a period of one year. Examinations shall be conducted at the end of the year for the respective subjects.

Medium of Instruction and Examinations

The medium of instruction and examinations for all the papers shall be in English.

Passing requirements

A Candidate shall be declared to have passed the examination in a subject if she/he secured not less than 40% in the University exam including practicals.

If a candidate doesn't complete the course successfully within a period of one year from the date of her/his joining she/he will not be eligible to receive the diploma

Classification of successful candidate

All candidates securing not less than 60% of the aggregate marks shall be declared to have passed in first class provided they have passed the examination in every subjects within one year of joining the course.

Other successful candidates shall be declared to have passed the examinations in second class.

Conferment of the Diploma

No candidate shall be eligible for conferment of the diploma unless she/he has undergone the prescribed course of study for a period of not less than one year.
